Dear Dudley, Raven, and Friends at Israel Food Outreach,

Thank you for your very generous donation to Love to the Needy. It comes at a good time. We are now serving evacuees from our borders with Lebanon in the North and Gaza in the South. In fact, we just came from delivering food, clothing, and linens to Pardes Hannah where they're sheltering 180 displaced people. We're also helping displaced families in Hadera and Or Akiva.

Also today, we brought food and clothing to Jerusalem for folks in need. The ranks of the poor have grown considerably since the war began, with many out of work because of displacement or changes brought about by having so many reservists called to duty. And of course, we don't forget the poor that we served before the war. We recently delivered food to two outreaches in Ariel, brought food to three outreaches in Tel Aviv, and to two in Kfar Saba. It's been a busy time for us.

So, we thank you sincerely for your help. This donation will go a long way to get food to folks who really need it.
