Dear Dudley,

Thank you for your call yesterday. We've been in touch with a few of the larger congregational outreaches to see what their needs are. First of all, we're getting many new immigrants due to the rise in antisemitism. When they get a government apartment here, it's empty. They



have primarily requested items for the kitchen like pots and pans for cooking, but any kitchen equipment would help (but nothing requiring electricity). The newcomers also need linens, primarily towels, but any linens would be helpful.

Aside from the new immigrants, the poor here will need winter clothing as we head into that season. Coats, jackets, socks are all helpful. And of course, there's the constant need for diapers.

I hope that gives you some ideas. We understand if these items may not be available to you. We're so grateful for whatever you're able to send.

As a prayer request, we now have many people returning to their towns and villages in the south, places like Sderot where so much savagery was committed. These people want to return to their employment and get their former lives back again but PTSD has left many still unable. Please pray that they will turn to the Prince of Peace. He is the only One who can bring healing to the otherwise unreachable places in their souls. And in the north, 250,000 have been evacuated because of the onslaught of missiles from Hezbollah. Imagine what it's like to suddenly have no access to your community, your home, your belongings, and your job. After so many months, in cramped quarters, their hope wears thin. It's taking its toll on families. Please pray. Israel needs a miracle. Thank you so much for your love.
